Day 1 ATHIRAPALLY(Pickup from Cochin)

Arrive at Cochin then proceed to Athirapally. Later visit to Aithrapally Waterfalls. Overnight stay at Athirapally.

Day 2 MUNNAR

Munnar hills situated at an altitude of 5000 to 8000 Ft above sea level and at the confluence of three mountain streams - Mudrapuzha, Nallathani & Kundala. This beautiful hill station was once the summer resort of the erstwhile British Government in South India. Sprawling Tea plantations, picture book towns, winding lanes and holiday facilities make this a popular resort town. Arrive & check in to your hotel. Day at own for leisure... Overnight at Munnar.



Day 3 MUNNAR

After breakfast proceed for sightseeing of Munnar. Visit to **Mattupetty Lake** and dam which is surrounded by tall hills and forest. Visit to Eravikulam National Park. **Echo Point** - This scenic place gets its name from the natural echo phenomenon here. Echo point is on the way to Top Station from Munnar. **Devikulam** - This idyllic hill station with its velvet lawns, exotic flora and fauna and the cool mountain air is a rare experience. Munnar is known for its extensive **tea estates**.

Return back to your hotel. Overnight at Munnar.

Day 4 VAGAMON

Vagamon is a hill station located in Kottayam-Idukki border of Idukki district of Kerala, India. It has a cool climate with the temperature between 10 and 23 °C during summer midday. It is situated 1,100 meters above sea level. Vagamon also known as the 'Scotland of Asia', was discovered by the British who found the place ideal for tea plantations and they were followed by



Christian missionaries who built their abode of service at Kurisumala in Vagamon. National Geographic Traveler has listed Vagamon on their directory of the '50 most attractive places to visit in India. Places of visit are Pine Forests, Kurisumala, Indo Swiss Project Dairy Farm, Vagamon medows, Thangal hill, Moopanpara. Overnight at Vagamon.

Day 5 ALLEPPEY

Today proceed to Alleppey and embark the Houseboat .Kettuvalloms – The traditional rice boats of Kerala – a romantic way to explore the unique web of lakes, lagoons, canals and rivers. These traditional houseboats of Kerala are one of the most enduring images of the backwaters – its natural, cocoon-like profile complimenting the surrounding countryside. These Kettuvalloms / houseboats concerted into an accommodation of one /two bedrooms, a kitchen and a sitting / dining area. Each cabin has a double bed and WC and washbasin. The crew has their own separate facilities. As the boat

slowly cruises through the backwaters, absorb this unusual representation of Kerala Life. You will be awed at the vast expanse of the paddy fields that surround these beautiful backwaters. The boat will stop in villages for you to experience a glimpse of the village life in rural Kerala. Overnight on houseboat. (Checkin time of houseboat – 12 noon)

Day 6 COCHIN SIGHTSEEING & DROP

Proceed to Kochi for return journey, on arrival at Kochi and proceed for sightseeing. Visit Jewish section where the first emigration of Jews to Kerala is said to have taken place in the 6th Century BC. The Jewish Synagogue in Mattancherry was built in 1568 and rebuilt in 1664 with Chinese willow – patterned tiles and gold crowns and has ancient scrolls. Visit the Dutch palace built by the Portuguese in 1510 and later taken over by Dutch. See St. Francis Church, the first European Church in India, where Vasco Da Gama was buried until his remains were taken back to Portugal and the Chinese Fishing nets named after the Country of their origin.

Munnar, Periyar and Alleppey being destinations with natural beauty, guide is not required. However, the drivers are well versed with these places & act as a guide.
Check in time on the houseboat is 11:30am & checkout is 8:30am (21 hours of stay)
Air Condition in the houseboat room will remain "ON" from 9pm to 6 am
Houseboat will remain stationary from 5.30pm till next morning.
Due to space constraint an extra mattress would be provided on the houseboat and not an extra bed.
Tickets for boat cruise at Thekkady have to be purchased by the clients on direct payment basis. As per the new regulations passed by Government of Kerala, tickets CANNOT be purchased by anyone on behalf of the clients hence clients will have to buy the same directly. Our driver would guide them to the ticket counter.

FACT FILE

1. The weather conditions in Kerala are tropical.
2. Travel light. Most of your requirements are available at the local markets.
3. A variety of cuisines are available in Kerala. Do pamper your gastronomic juices by indulging in the scrumptious Kerala delicacies but take care not to eat from the unhygienic roadside stalls. It is advisable to drink only the packaged drinking water or mineral water.
4. It helps to remember that most temples do not allow foreign tourists and non-Hindus to enter. Even Hindu men are allowed into the sanctum of many only if they go bare-chested and don a dhoti and not trousers. Women are expected to wear a SAREE and surprisingly while a trouser or even the ethnic Indian SalwarKameez clad women may be restricted, a skirt donned lady will be allowed to pass.
5. Do remember to remove your footwear as you enter the temples or a MALAYALEE household.
6. Photography is restricted in many temples & museum. Do obtain permissions or special tickets for using the camera where necessary.
7. It is advisable to carry a list of emergency numbers such as printouts of the list provided in Maps Of India, Kerala Telephone Directory. However if such a listing is not available on hand, the police are contactable by dialing 100 and the fire & rescue team and ambulance services respond to 101.
8. Most high class hotels and resorts provide a 24 hour doctor on call service and house pharmacies. However tourists are advised to carry a kit of emergency and essential medications.
9. Kerala's allure is wide spread and the number of tourists visiting this natural paradise is ever increasing. Hence it is advisable to book your tickets and make reservations well in advance.
10. Do go in for Ayurvedic treatment only at authorized resorts and holistic treatment centers.
11. The banks of Kerala, like the rest of India operate between 10 am and 2 pm, Monday to Friday except on public holidays.
12. To get the best deals from curio shopping by bargaining. Take a local guide along as he is capable of getting you coveted souvenirs at throwaway prices.
13. The best season to visit this sylvan state is from November to March. Not only is the climate pleasant and windy, this is also the festival season and brings out the best performing and ritual arts performances. However most Ayurvedic resorts hold their rejuvenating programs from March to September.
14. Do remember to save the bills, vouchers tickets and vouchers amassed on your Kerala tour. These may be made into a scrapbook or a travelogue to remind you of the heady days spent in God's own Country.

The above are general consideration to be taken into account on your tour to Kerala. However it is important to develop a humane relation with the inhabitants of the region because those will be the best treasured reward of your trip to this tourist friendly state. Do put forth your suggestions for improvement without criticism in the suggestion books available at most tourist attractions and above all do show appreciation where it is due. A kind word or a pat on the back of a helpful guide goes a long way to make your trip rosy.
